Our Location


Mid & East Antrim forms part of the wider metropolitan area of Belfast. We offer a range of investment opportunities as a regional hub location to support companies seeking a hybrid approach to flexible working.

Telecoms infrastructure providers such as the BT Group and Virgin Media have invested heavily in recent years to improve the infrastructure across Northern Ireland. For example, £150m has been invested by Virgin since 2016 meaning their network of nearly 400,000 mostly urban-based homes and businesses (including Ballymena and Carrickfergus) can benefit from average download speeds of 1,140Mbps.




